# A PERFECT DAY IN ... Stockholm




## **OVERVIEW:**

## START YOUR DAY: DROP COFFEE

Sip a latte at Drop Coffee, rated the 3rd best coffee shop in the world.



Get here as early as possible as this is the top tourist attraction in the city. It should definitely be at the top of your list of what to do in Stockholm!



The Swedish warship Vasa was supposed to be the flagship of the Swedish naval fleet. It sank on its first voyage out of Stockholm harbor in 1628 and there it sat, preserved by the cold, brackish waters until it was salvaged in 1961. The restoration work that has been done on the ship is absolutely remarkable.

## MID DAY EATS: HÖTORGSHALLEN

Stockholm's best indoor food market, Hötorgshallen boasts an array of traditional Swedish and international food stalls. Take a stand-up lunch with a long-cooked Turkish ox tongue burger, a halal lamb sandwich, or Swedish comfort classic dishes at Saluplats Husman.

## AFTERNOON ACTIVITY: EXPLORE GAMLA STAN

The old town in Stockholm. Complete with cobblestone streets, beautifully bright buildings contrasted against a usually grey sky – this neighborhood has a Scandinavian charm that you'll love. Stop for a coffee and pastry at one of the many cafes. Going for a FIKA is a very Swedish thing. Though difficult to translate it basically means to meet up for a coffee and a piece of cake or pastry. Sweden enjoys a highly developed culture when it comes to baked goods, and everywhere in Stockholm you'll find cafes and cake shops brimming with atmosphere, character and quality, whether traditional or contemporary–creative. Afterwards, consider spending time at the Noble Museum, which is located in Gamla Stan.



## TIME TO DINE: DEN GYLDENE FREDEN

This is a Guinness World Records dining spot, as it is the world's oldest restaurant with the same surroundings. Since 1722, the kitchen has been cooking traditional Swedish cuisine, including smoked reindeer, meatballs and herring. High ceilings, long wooden tables, soft lighting, wooden floors, allow the guest to feel the history of the ancient Stockholm and appreciate the smells and tastes of the traditional strong and intense flavors of Swedish dishes.



#### LATE NIGHT FUN: ICE BAR

The Ice Bar in Stockholm is one of those slightly overpriced experiences that you want to have once, but might not ever do again. Best to make a reservation beforehand, as it only fits 20 people at a time.
