

A PERFECT DAY IN... Dubrovnik



OVERVIEW:

Dubrovnik offers an unusual blend of modern culture and ancient tradition. Marble-like polished limestone streets, a labyrinth of alleyways and breathtaking architecture compose the unique atmosphere of the Old Town. You'll experience a true variety of sightseeing, leisure and outdoor adventures here.

START YOUR DAY: **RESTAURANT DUBRAVKA**

Great for breakfasts, with a large terrace just outside the Pile gate Dubravka has one of the best views of the city walls and out to sea. That makes for the perfect combination and best start to your day.

MORNING ACTIVITY: **WALK THE CITY WALLS**

Any visit to Dubrovnik should begin with a walk around the magnificent medieval city walls (approx. \$15 per person), dating back to the 13th-century. A complete circuit is a mile and a quarter and will take well over an hour, during which you get ever-changing perspectives over the terracotta rooftops of the old town and the glistening Adriatic Sea.

Bri's Tip: They open at 8am, and that would be the best time to go. But your tickets just outside the main gate and bring bottles of water, as there are a few kiosks but way overpriced.



MID DAY EATS: **AZUR**

Azur is a relatively new restaurant in the old town, located in a alleyway close to a popular "hole-in-the-wall" Buza bar (where you might be headed next!) with an Asian-Mediterranean cuisine. Spotting something of a gap in the market, alongside the carbon copy seafood places in Dubrovnik, well-traveled owner and Dubrovnik native Darko's Azur concept is quite straightforward – Asian technique and Mediterranean ingredients combining to produce beautiful tasty food.



AFTERNOON ACTIVITY: **BEACH TIME + CLIFF JUMPING AT BUŽA BAR**

Beach Time: Buža beach is a beautiful and unique place which can be found on the boulders at the bottom of the South wall of Dubrovnik. You can access Buža by following the small streets of the old town behind the cathedral, passing through a small door in the wall and descending down the steps that lead to the boulders.

Buža Bar: This is known to be one of the most beautiful bars in the city. It is also known as “hole-in-the-wall” as Buža means “hole.” So as you might imagine, this place is not easy to find. It sits on the cliffs jutting out over the Adriatic Sea, and you literally go through a hole-in-the-wall to get there. You are able to jump off one of the various sized cliffs into the ocean if you’re up for it.



TIME TO DINE: **PROTO**

Located in the very heart of Dubrovnik Old Town, Proto has an amazing upstairs terrace and relaxing interior. You’ll spend a little more at this Michelin-starred restaurant, but the quality and service will certainly match the prices. They are known for creative fresh fish dishes.

Bri’s Tip: Make sure you book ahead to enjoy a meal on their pleasant rooftop terrace inside the city walls.

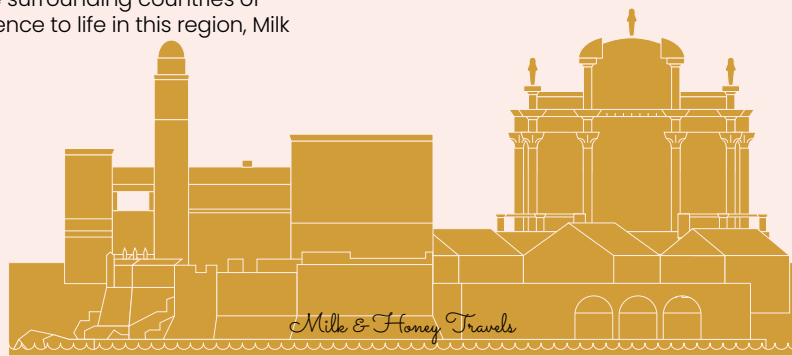


LATE NIGHT FUN: **CAVE BAR MORE**

As the name suggests, Cave Bar More is located in a cave! It’s part of the President Valamar Hotel just outside the Old Town. You definitely don’t have to stay in the hotel to visit the bar though. While this can also be a great place to come and relax during the day while you watch the waves crash against the cliff walls, nighttime is also fun. Come to party it up in the evening with the best selection of local wines to be found in the city.
