ABOUT SEVILLE






START YOUR DAY

Bar el Comercio

Many claim they're the best churros in Seville, and they might just be right! This charming bar, Bar Comercio, was founded in 1904 and is still part of the Rivera family. You might have to wait for a table here, as their breakfasts are famous throughout the city.

Aire Ancient Baths

MID DAY EATS

Bodeguita Romero

No bar combines a traditional atmosphere with beautifully prepared Sevillano cuisine quite like Bodeguita Romero. The locally run restaurant embraces the homemade cooking style of this region! Go for the Papas Aliñas (marinated potatoes) doused with olive oil and mixed with green onions and peppers and the Presa Ibérico (Iberian pork). Pair any dish with a glass of local sherry and soak up the local atmosphere!










AFTERNOON ACTIVITY




TIME TO DINE






LATE NIGHT FUN La Casa del Flamenco
